As an active member of the Ed-Tech Team at the International School of Business, HAN University of Applied Sciences in the Netherlands, Parisa has been striving to embrace the critical, responsible, and ethical use of GenAI in university education. Her goal has been to explore the risks and rewards of GenAI in transforming day-to-day teaching, learning, and assessment. Over the course of this journey, she has explored over 100 GenAI tools and AI-designed various modules on business communication. In this session, she will share the lessons learned, the best tools tested and implemented, and the practical insights gained to effectively integrate AI into Business English education.



Parisa Mehran is a futurist dedicated to exploring and designing technologies that can better shape the future of education. She holds a PhD in Computer Assisted Language Learning and is a lecturer in Business Communication. She serves as an Al advisor on the Ed-Tech Team at HAN International School of Business.

Key AI technologies that are impacting on teaching and learning

Based on over 80,000 subscribers to his YouTube channel and the surveys he runs on his website, Russell's presentation will highlight some of the key AI technologies that are impacting language teaching. The focus is on time-saving tools and tools that can extend students' learning outside the classroom. This is a talk packed with ideas based around a few key technologies that offer a free option and can be immediately implemented into your teaching and learning.



Russell Stannard is a multi awardwinning Educational Technologist and founder of teachertrainingvideos.com. He received awards from the British Council ELTONS, the Times Higher and the University of Westminster for his work in the use of ICT in education. He trains language educators in the use of technology to enhance teaching and learning. His focus is on the use of technology outside of the classroom to extend learning options for students but he has also worked on the development of blended learning delivery and more recently Al. He has presented in more than 50 countries.



Innovating Business English Curriculum Design for the Al Era

11.25-11.55 Workshop

The educational setting is rapidly developing with the rise of Artificial Intelligence (AI), enabling educators to create personalised and diverse learning tasks that enhance course design and student engagement. This presentation explores the use of the Understanding by Design (UbD) framework in Business English courses, focusing on its core principles and the "backward design" concept.

In this talk, Phoebe will provide a detailed example of a BE class designed using the UbD framework, demonstrating its practical application.
Additionally, she will illustrate how AI tools can be integrated into BE course design, maximising the effectiveness and engagement of BE courses in the AI era.



Phoebe Hui-Ju Tsai is an Assistant Professor in the Language Center at National Taipei University, Taiwan. She received her Doctorate in Education from the University of Durham in the UK. Her research interests include Al writing tools, language learning motivation, ESP curriculum design & assessment, and EMI instruction.

She helps her clients present with impact (native & nonnative speakers) through 4 powerful communication pillars: Presentation skills, Language, Voice & Body and Pronunciation, using Yoodli, an Al app, & online courses.





Creating language courses with Al

13.00-13.30 Talk

The advent of ChatGPT and other Al tools led Pete to writing materials in a different way, and he noticed two major things: On the one hand, his 'cowriter' is fast, an indispensable research tool which helps in brainstorming content. On the other, it is biased, understands only numbers, hallucinates, is prone to error, steals unashamedly and needs enough energy to power a small country. This essentially practical talk critically analyses his first steps in content creation in these early days of the Al era. It includes 'tips and tricks', caveats and reflections on his own experience so far. It will be of interest to language teachers who also create content, and who (like Pete) are keen on leveraging the benefits of AI yet are somewhat conflicted about the ethical issues involved.



Pete Sharma curates a blog which critically explores Al. He teaches online and writes content for language courses. Pete is a regular conference presenter and the coauthor of several books on educational technology and business English. He has a Masters in Educational Technology and language teaching.

Enhancing teaching and learning through AI-learned wisdom recipes

This encapsulates her 30 years' experience in education, first in teaching, teacher training and school management, then in publishing. She's also an international speaker and a BC ELTons judge.



Al Prompting for Business English

This session will look at some of the potential uses of AI for business English and particularly how we can develop our understanding of prompting to both develop useful and engaging business English materials and as a way of helping our students develop their business and English skills and knowledge.



Nik Peachey is Director of Pedagogy at PeacheyPublications, an independent digital publishing company that specialises in the design of digital learning materials for the English language classroom.

He has been involved in Education since 1990 as a teacher, trainer, educational consultant and project manager. He has more than 25 years experience of working specifically with online, remote and blended learning environments.

He has worked all over the world teaching, training teachers and developing innovative and creative products. He is a two-time British Council Innovations award winner and has been shortlisted six times.

Learner autonomy with AI – How to exploit the tools our students already use?

14.25 - 14.55 Talk

This talk addresses the topic of learner autonomy and how it can be helped with various AI tools. The point here is that most of the tools our students use on a daily basis (such as grammar and spellcheckers, translators, chatbots, dictation apps) already have one or more AI features but they might not be aware of it. By showing them some tips and tricks on how they can exploit these applications even more, they will be able to take charge of their learning and maximise their learning time.



Jo Szoke a freelance teacher trainer, Al specialist, and learning designer. She teaches English as a foreign language to adults, trains pre-service teachers and university staff at a Hungarian university, and is a regular presenter at TEFL conferences. In her free time, Jo loves going downhill and jumping around in foreign forests on her mountain bike.
